1. Librarian's Report

Brenda reported that as there are no face-to-face activities at the libraries, they are offering online activities for Science Week and for the next School Holidays there are likely to be 'take-away' and online activities. Katie Brown is the local representative a group set up to develop and promote the libraries Facebook and online presence. RTRL have started online author events which can be accessed on the RTRL homepage website via YouTube. The last of the Byron Bay furniture that FOL is paying to recover have now been completed (see attached photo). The current COVID plan remains in place, the only possible future development maybe the use of facemasks. Even with the limitation on numbers allowed into the libraries at any one-time Byron and Brunswick Heads Libraries have not experienced problems however there are times at Mullumbimby where patrons have had to line up to get entry due the numbers of patrons at any one time. A new printer is to be installed in the multifunction area at the Byron Bay library which will allow patrons to use photocopy card access independently of staff.

2. Minutes for the July Meeting

3. Correspondence

4. Financial Report

Richard reported the accumulated balance as of 16 August is \$40,063. Future known commitments are approximately \$4000 for the furniture reupholstering. In the past couple of months FOL has contributed approximately \$8000 to supporting the libraries. A possible future project could be a new check-out desk for Brunswick Heads and recovering of some chairs at the Mullumbimby branch. Richard moved the report be accepted, seconded Mary.

There were no new members in the past month.

6. General Business

Palace Cinema event 'The Booksellers'

Janene reported that the movie event was very successful and for little effort on FOL's part we raised \$300. All those who attended enjoyed the event and the Palace were wonderful to deal with. It was agreed that FOL will consider the possibility of future movie events with the Palace.

Byron Shire Council meeting re grants for Brunswick Heads Library and Byron Library Garden maintenance.

Beryl reported that Sarah Ford is currently not available due to family matters so she spoke with Lisa Brennan who works with Sarah at the Council. Lisa advised that the new Grants Officer is Alex who can be contacted to enquire about the re-submission of the 2018 proposal to refurbish and extend the Brunswick Heads Library. Beryl also raised the need for garden maintenance at the Byron Bay library. Lisa will refer the matter on to the Garden Maintenance section of the

Council. **Action:** Beryl will contact Alex at the Council to find out if it is feasible re-submit the Brunswick Heads Library proposal to an appropriate grant scheme this year.

Book sorting & collection for 2021

Janene reported that after yesterday's book sorting working bee FOL is up-to-date with sorting all books in storage. As yet FOL has not put out a call for books but if someone is aware of books that would be worthwhile collecting can they let Janene know and a pick-up will be organized. Janene has put aside a box of books for Barbara Barratt to collect for pricing. **Action:** Janene and Barbara to liaise to organize the pick-up of the books.

Mary is currently in discussions with publishers and authors on future face-to-face and zoom book events in the coming months. Current books proposed are Christine Jackman's *Turn Down the Noise*; Belinda Alexandra's *The Mystery Woman* and Di Morrisey's new book *Before the Storm* which is set in Victoria and comes out in late October.
